History of Pinnacle Peak Park

In November 1999, the City received the title to the 150 acres of Pinnacle Peak Park. The main trail was completed and the City of Scottsdale received the title to the land. The Grand Opening was April 20, 2002 and attracts over 1200 visitors! .

In 2005 In December, Friends of Pinnacle Peak (FOPP), a non-profit organization separate from the City of Scottsdale, is established to accept donations for our park programs, preserving the park and various educational activities.
